

What is an Intergroup Representative

About the time you say, “I may as well not be here,” or “The Service Committee can operate without my help”, you need to take a look at why your job here is so important. To ensure that your group makes its voice heard, as an Intergroup Representative, you have the power to:

1. Change the location of the Intergroup Office;
2. Elect the members of the Service Committee;
3. Serve on a nominating Committee that considers and recommend nominees for the Service Committee;
4. Along with five other delegates, call a special meeting with prior notice to all Representatives 5 days in advance by telephone or electronically of the meeting’s location and business;
5. Approve or disapprove the proposed annual budget for the upcoming year;
6. Approve or disapprove all major purchases or leases of assets over \$150.00;
7. Approve or disapprove all Representatives Meeting’s minutes and Treasurer’s Reports;
8. Examine results of annual audit of the Treasurer’s books;
9. Serve on a by-laws review committee.

The functions of the Service Committee of Intergroup include:

1. Follow the directives of the Intergroup Representative majority voice and vote;
2. Oversee the operations of the Intergroup Office;
3. Select, hire, terminate and assist the Intergroup Office Manager and Bookkeeper;
4. Ensure that all groups in the community who want to participate are invited to join Intergroup and keep them informed of its services and activities;
5. Supervise and approve any Intergroup Office expenditures, financial transactions or leases of assets, seeking Representative approval when required;
6. Consider, evaluate and recommend to the Representatives other ways and means of aiding the AA program in accordance with its Traditions and principles and in conformity with GSO guidelines.

Delegates are important – Intergroup is controlled by YOU!

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
