Committee Reports:

Hospitals & Institutions: Ron reported that the Living Sober group donated Grapevines – he added to them the box he keeps for donations. There are Big Books available when taking meetings to institutions – up to 2 at a time – and as many Grapevines as you want. We can use volunteers for the 23 facilities we take meetings to (48 meetings a week). Meetings are open at the MC jail – 5:30 on Wednesday. Volunteers need to attend an orientation meeting at which they will complete an application and be fingerprinted. The next orientation meeting hasn't been scheduled yet. One man attends the meeting at the state prison in Okeechobee Wednesday at 5:30.

Desk Volunteer Coordinator: John reported that there are two time slots open – Tuesdays from 9-12 and Friday from 12-3. If there are other days or times that work better for a volunteer, it could be possible to switch slots with someone. Just call the office.

Events: Kathy S. reported that she is all set for the dance tonight at Cambridge Commons in Hobe Sound. She has lots of volunteers. Tickets will be available at the door. Doors open at 6:30, speaker at 7 and dancing until 9.

Office Manager: Georgia reported that donations are down this month. She has a folder ready for the accountants for their annual review. Also, she doesn't expect any books from WSO until September. There are plenty of Big Books but we are out of other popular books.

Old Business –
